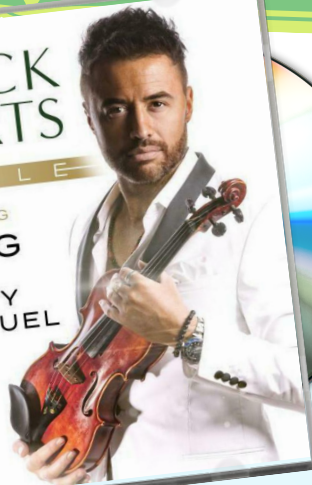
You can marry into them, but can you ever really be one of them?

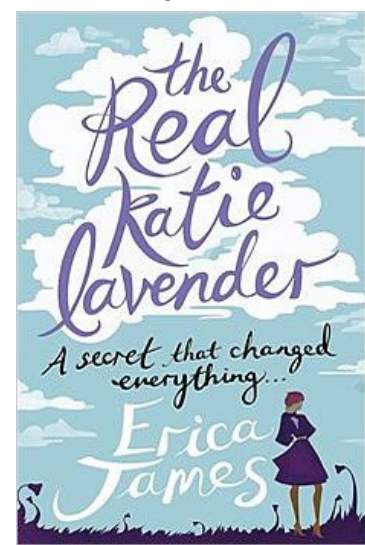


Many of Erica's books deal with major life changes, the resilience of her characters, with a dash of drama and some romance to make sure you just can't put it down until the final page.

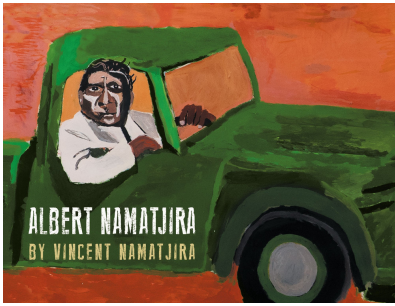

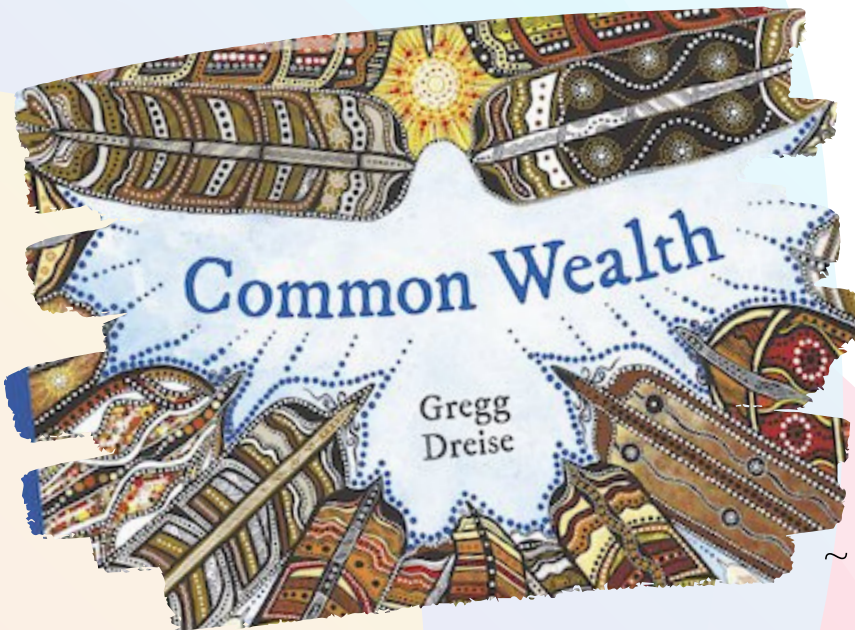
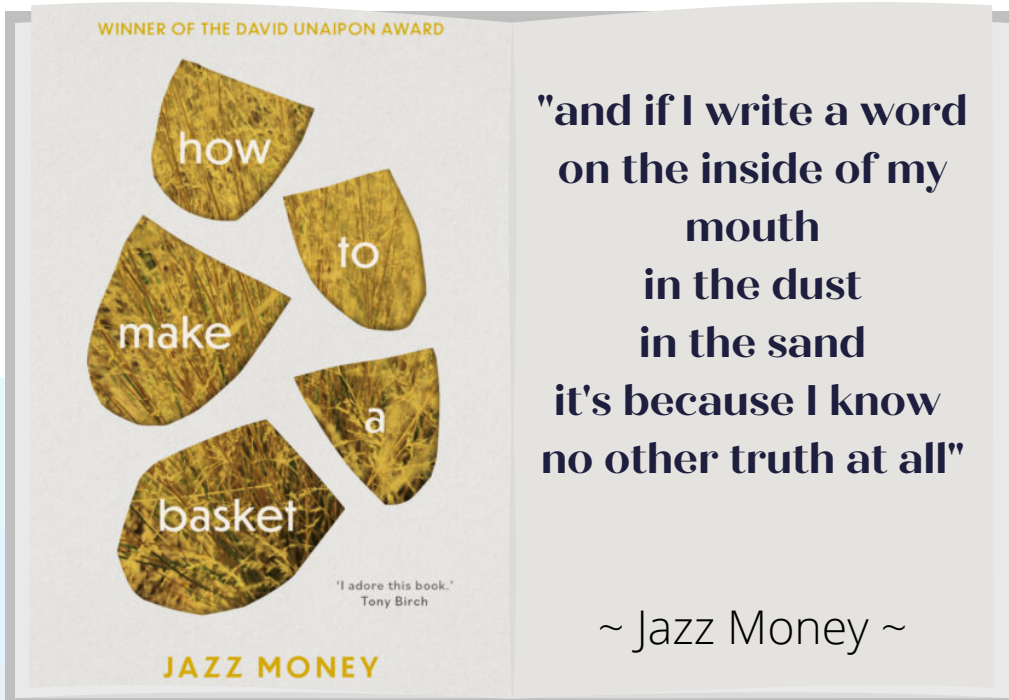

Library FAQs

We get a lot of the same questions whilst working on our library customer service desks, so we thought we'd answer some of them here and maybe they'll help you too!

Do you need PC access?

We have PCs for public use available at both of our locations, during our opening hours.

You just need your library card, or present us with your valid ID to receive a guest pass for the day. PC access is for 90 minutes per day.

A Justice of the Peace visits our Gawler Civic Centre Library every Tuesday, Thursday, and Saturday mornings from 10:30am until 12:30pm. *Bookings are not required.*

Our non-fiction collection is organised using the *Dewey Decimal System*. This uses numbers to allocate a position on the shelf for all the different titles. Most subjects are grouped together this way. If you have any questions about this system, please don't hesitate to ask one of our staff members.

The OneCard Network gives our customers the access to over a million items over the whole South Australian public library network! Which means you have the ability to order items from all over the state and to return items to whichever library is most convenient to you

"Behind the Scenes: The History of Theatre and Entertainment in Gawler"

Theatre productions and musical entertainments have been central community events in Gawler since the 1850's.

Peer 'behind the scenes' of some of these productions and learn more about the creativity and effort that went into amazing productions including the 1881 performance of HMS Pinafore which the visiting Australian Eleven Cricket Team attended.

Marvel at the 1937 production of 'New Moon' which included a cast of 170 and an orchestra of 27 local musicians. There were 4 separate committees overseeing the event. Imagine!

Take a selfie on our recreated 1880's stage, test your knowledge of musical instruments at the big band interactive. Smell the stage paint, marvel at the costumes, immerse yourself in the stories of entertainment in Gawler over the last 170 years.
