Rethink, Refuse, Reduce, Reuse, Recycle and Repair. This month in Off the Shelf, we're focusing on Repair!

There's lots of reasons why repairing an item is a better choice than replacing it. Repairing an item is usually cheaper than replacing it, saving you money, but repairing also reduces demand for new materials and energy resources - so repairing is a big win for the planet.


Some people believe that giving an item new life through repairs strengthens your sense of connection and ownership to your belongings. Did you see the BBC program The Repair Shop? It's a great demonstration of the emotions and sentiments we give to objects and heirlooms, and how important it can be to repair such things.


AUTHOR HIGHLIGHT



Hannah Kent is a guest speaker during this year's Adelaide Writers' Week and we thought we might shine a light on this Adelaidean.

You may have seen her titles on our shelves, *Burial Rites* (2013), *The Good People* (2016) and most recently *Devotion* (2021).






Her debut novel, Burial Rites won many awards; ABIA Literary Fiction Book of the Year, the Indie Awards Debut Fiction Book of the Year, and the Victorian Premier's People's Choice Award and was translated into more than 30 languages! Her second novel, The Good People is currently being adapted for film.

Hannah's latest title begins in Prussia in 1836 then moves through the years and across the seas to Adelaide in 1838.

This book is a transformative story dealing with religion, relationships and the power of devotion.







EVENING READS




Mindful Knotting

This session drew it's inspiration from Lise Silva Gomes' **Sacred Knots: create, adorn,** and transform through the art of knotting

Attendees had the opportunity to design and make a knotting board, then begin learning some decorative knots that can be used in mindful practice to still the mind and banish the stresses of the day.

A knotting board can be helpful when working with intricate knots. You may also find one handy if you like the idea of knotting on the couch, sitting in bed or out in the garden.

You can purchase cork boards relatively cheaply or make one out of cardboard, polystyrene or wood covered with foam. Cover your board with fabric of your choice and attach with glue, staples or stitches.



BOOKS REINVENTED

Words do change their meaning over time but here are some commonly misconstrued words.

Many people think that
"prevaricate" means the same as
"procrastinate".

"Procrastinate" means "to put off
until tomorrow".

"Prevaricate" means "to act or
speak evasively", "to deviate from
the truth".

The word "conniving" is sometimes used to mean "scheming in an underhand manner".

But "conniving" means "turning a blind eye to".

The term "forensic" is often used to refer to " DNA, fingerprints and traces evidence of a crime.

However "forensic" means "to do with the law". It is used erroneously as an abbreviation of "forensic science" or "forensic medicine". It makes no sense to speak of "forensic evidence". All evidence of a crime is forensic.

While it may have been daunting to break these books, we're confident that we've given them a new lease of life.



We are launching our new **Being Digital** technology workshops here at the Gawler Libraries in March and our first topic is about learning to keep yourself and your identity safe when online.


These sessions will be held once a month on a Monday morning, with a different topic each month. Places are very limited so if you're interested you need to call the library **08 8522 9213** to book your spot.
