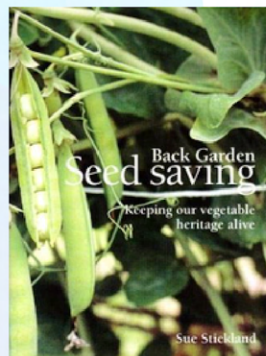
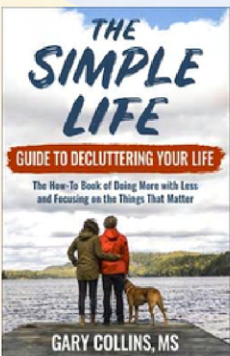
SPRING CLEANING

Spring has sprung! And while that means we will start to enjoy longer days and warmer weather, for many of us it also means time to dive into Spring Cleaning! But have you ever wondered why Spring Cleaning is a thing?

Spring Cleaning has its origins in several traditions. In the early 1800s, general cleaning in spring was a necessity after a winter of using lamps fueled with kerosene or similar and warming the house with a wood fire. Spring Cleaning remains popular, because we know it's healthy to ventilate our homes and remove the dust that accumulates during winter.

Spring Cleaning also relates to cultural and religious beliefs, with links to Jewish Passover and many Christian faiths observing cleaning rituals. In Iranian culture Nowruz (Persian New Year) falls on the first day of Spring. This holiday includes a thorough house cleaning called takouni (shaking the house). Meanwhile the Chinese also clean their houses the day before their new year, to get rid of bad luck and make space for good fortune.

Backyard Bird Count



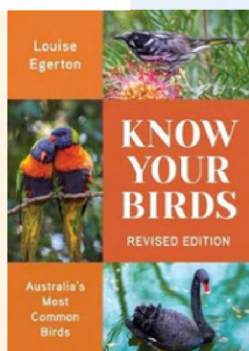
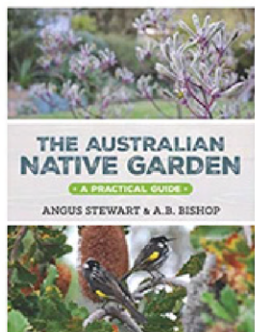
Do you love watching the local birdlife that visit your backyard? Are some of your feathery friends, regular visitors that you've come to recognise?

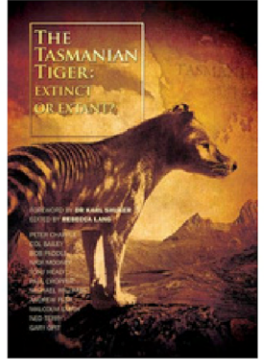
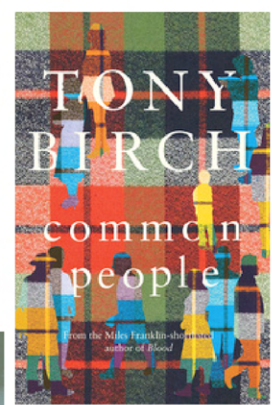
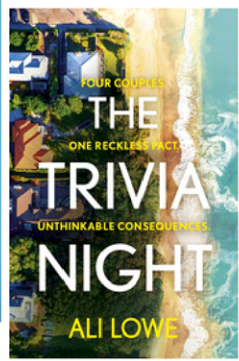
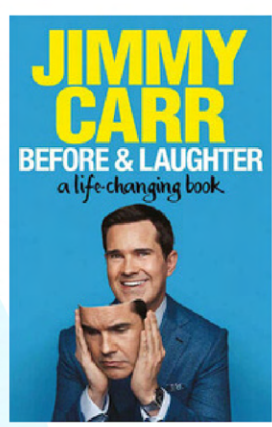
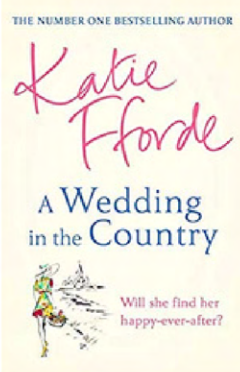
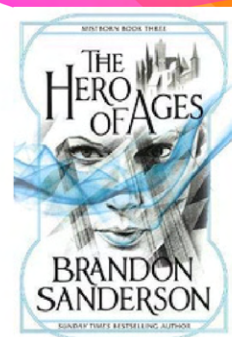
Want to know what the library staff are reading?

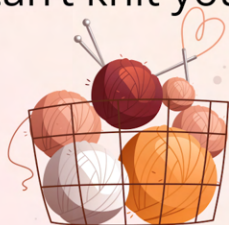

Untapped: The Australian Literary Heritage Project.

A collaboration between authors, libraries, and researchers, working together to identify Australia's lost literary treasures and bring them back to readers.



THE AUSTRALIAN LITERARY HERITAGE PROJECT

There are currently 161 titles available as eBooks through this project's work. You can use the library's Borrow Box catalogue to read any of these titles. Just download the app, login with your library card number and PIN to get started. If you'd like any assistance with this process, please ask one of the library staff next time you visit either of our library locations. Some of the authors you'd find in this catalogue include, *Garry Disher, Gillian Rubinstein, Isobelle Carmody, Allayne Webster, Mem Fox, Gillian Mears, Anita Heiss* and many, many more!

So what does this project do? Many of Australia's books are now out-of-print, which makes them inaccessible to readers. This can vary from local histories and memoirs to our favourite children's titles. Even winners of literary prizes, such as the Miles Franklin Literary Award, can become lost unless someone can make the effort in making them accessible.

The Untapped project also creates a new income source for Australian authors, who would like to see their works available for borrowers in libraries, but currently have limited options for their out-of-print titles. The Cultural Heritage Research Centre is here to help!

We are located on the lower ground floor of the Gawler Civic Centre. We welcome researchers of all levels. Access is available to the large and unique collections that form the Gawler Heritage Collection.

The Gawler Heritage Collection contains:

The **Gawler Institute Collection**: administrative records of the former Gawler Institute together with art works, objects, and the Reading Room historical books.

The **Gawler Local History Collection**: items that were collected or donated during the researching and writing of the *History of Gawler and its region* by Dr Derek Whitelock. New items are continually being added. It includes books, some oral history recordings and transcripts, and some video recordings.

The **Gawler Civic Collection**: items given to or purchased by the Gawler Council by virtue of its Civic role.

All items are available to researchers for use within the Research Room of the Cultural Heritage Centre.

Additional access to the Heritage Collection is by appointment.



The Collections are currently being catalogued and new entries are being added online weekly. Cataloguing will be a long-term project so please contact the Cultural Heritage Centre if you have an enquiry about an item in the Gawler Heritage Collection but cannot find it in the catalogue.

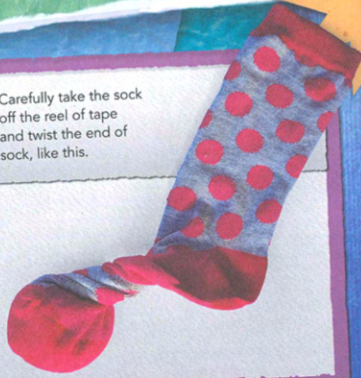

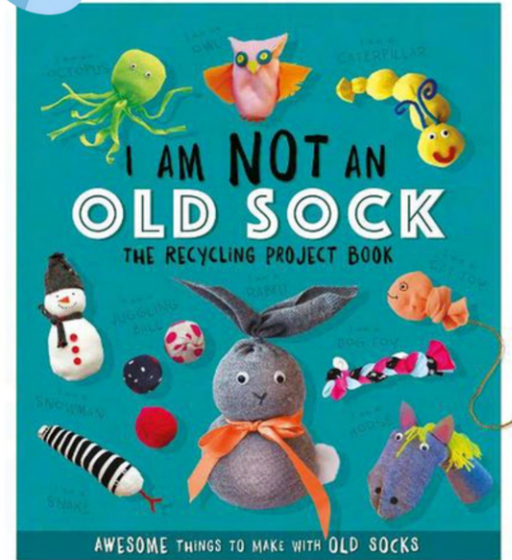
Again, twist the end of the sock, as you did in Step 2. Put your hand into the sock and repeat Step 3.
