OFF THE SHELF

Stories, fictional or otherwise, are what fills our libraries full of curious people wanting to read more about the world around us. But there always seems to be something special about reading a biography, whether penned by the subject of the book or another writer. Knowing these are true stories, hearing about someone's struggles, their accomplishments, winning out over adversity, or reading a funny tale to humour the reader. We can empathise or be shocked by the text. We enjoy knowing we aren't the only ones feeling lost, angry, triumphant, in love, excited, devastated, and happy. Finding out about a history you didn't really know, or getting the opportunity to better understand someone else's perspective all through the art of storytelling. It's a powerful medium. We have so many titles, on so many subjects, in so many different formats at the library. You can find physical items in the library such as books for adults, teens or children, in large or dyslexic print, on CD or DVD. We also have an extensive digital collection available through the Libraries SA apps - Borrow Box and Libby. Ebooks and eAudiobooks are FREE, like the physical collection, and available 24/7 for you to download using your own devices. With over three hundred events for all ages, the Nature Festival is back again and full of creative ways to connect with nature and each other.

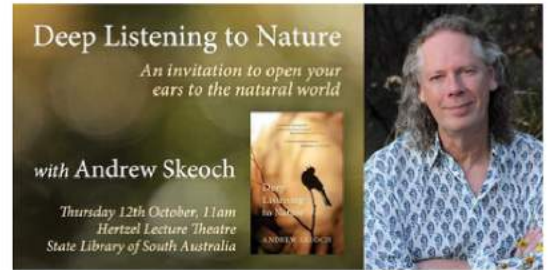
You may be inclined to improve your wellbeing with mindful gardening, or perhaps a 'moon feast' for body, mind and soul, strikes your fancy.

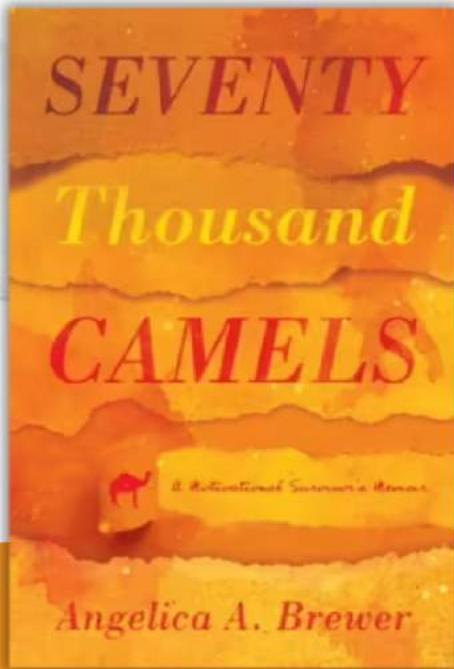
There are also plenty of practical workshops to experience such as writing, eco-printing, garden design, propagation, or tool repair.

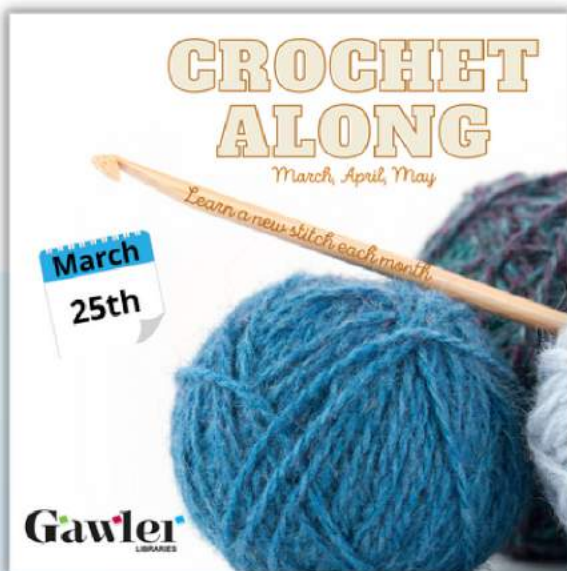

South Australia. The mural in the Civic Centre is a nature theme, bringing different elements of the Gawler environment into the building. The meeting of the Gawler rivers, Parridla Taikondi Park, a Bee Eater bird and the local yellow bottlebrush features in this mural with the large Crimson Rosella birds that draw the eye up the large wall of the café area.

DIGITAL LITERACY

What on earth is RFID?



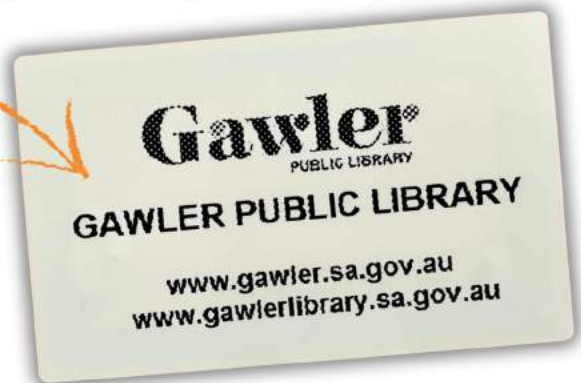
Library staff love to help you with your borrowing, but for times when we're busy or you prefer to serve yourself, we have three clever machines (2 @ Civic Centre & 1 @ Evanston Gardens) to help you borrow your library items. The self-serve machines are located at the library entrance, and they use Radio Frequency Identification (RFID) technology to scan your library items and check them out to your account.

How does RFID work?

Library staff place tags on all library items when they are purchased. Within this tag, there is a microchip that holds information and an antenna. These tags are encoded with information about the item. The RFID reader in the self-serve machine emits a signal that searches for a tag. When you place your library items on the self-serve machine, the signal hits the tag in the item and accesses the encoded information, allocating the item to your library account.

There's no need to physically scan your items anymore, simply place them on the platform and allow the machine to do the work for you!

DOWN THE LINE COMMUNICATION IN GAWLER

EXHIBITION NOW OPEN!



The new Heritage Gallery exhibition 'Down the Line' explores the themes of communication and its role in building communities. The exhibition explores the impact of the postal service, the telegraph and the telephone on the Gawler community allowing them to stay connected to each other and the wider world.

View rare early colonial letters, telegraph equipment brought to South Australia by Charles Todd and a collection of funky antique phones. Make a call using the magneto telephone and try your hand at morse code with our telegraph equipment. Hear the voices of the women of the Gawler telephone exchange as they 'connect your call'.

This exhibition is an opportunity to understand more about the evolution of communication technologies that have been fundamental in keeping communities informed and connected.
