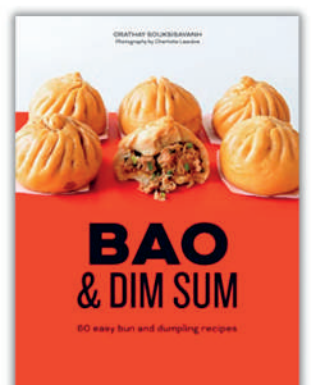
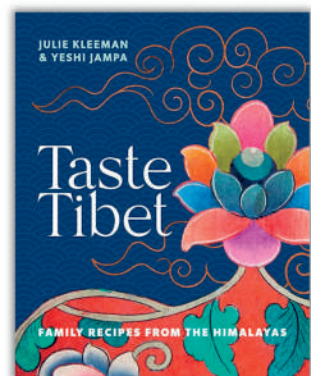
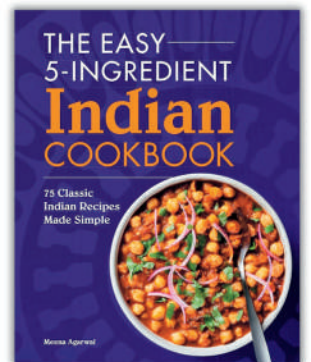
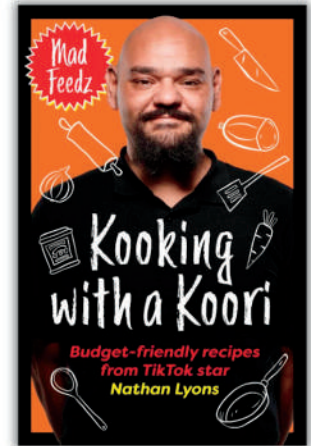
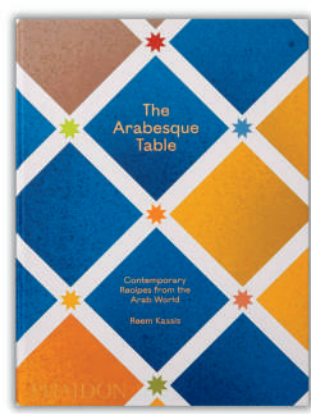
SPICE UP YOUR KITCHEN THIS AUTUMN!

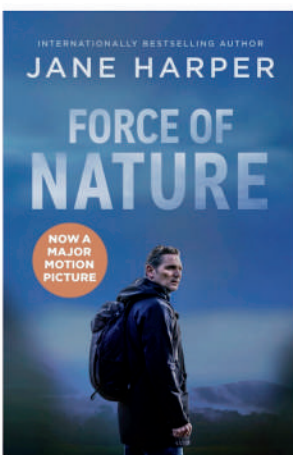
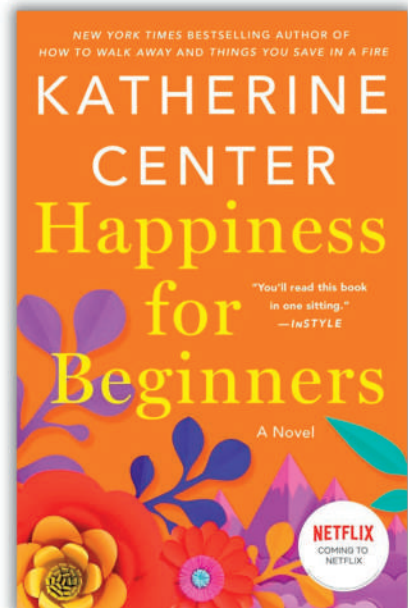
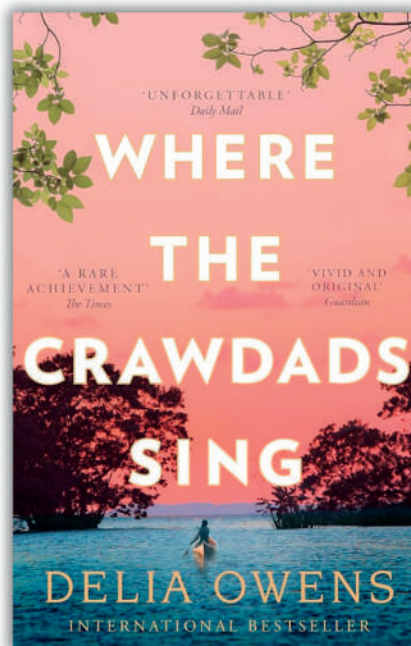
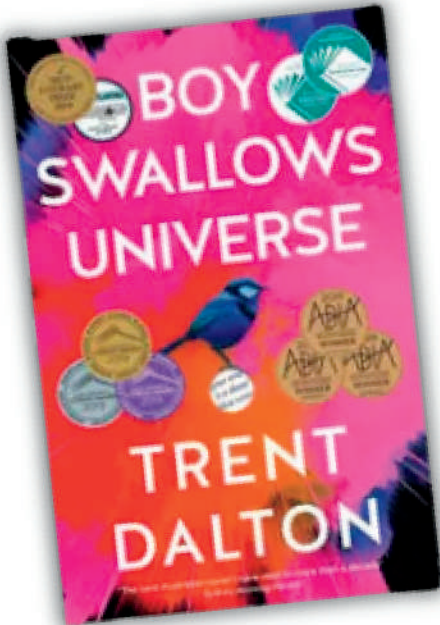
EVENING Reads

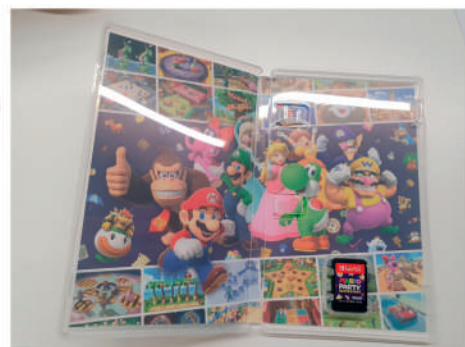
BEHIND the shelves

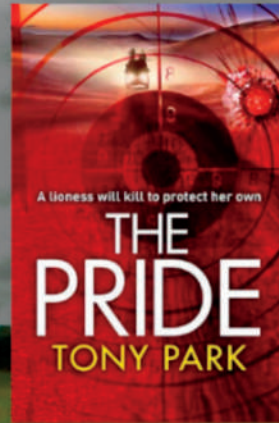
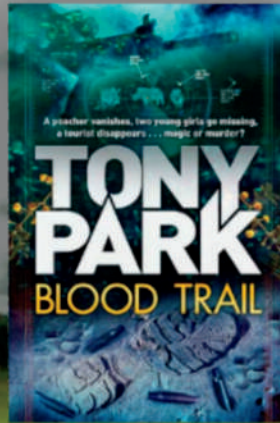
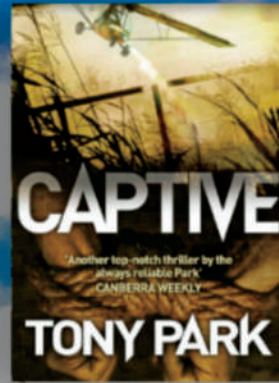
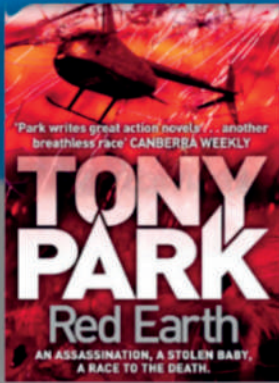
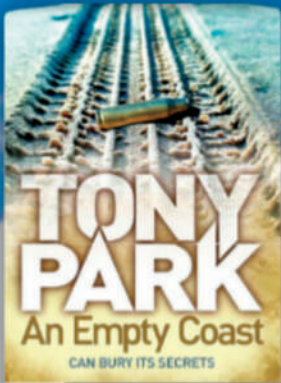
In Technical Services, we wave our wands (or barcode scanners) to transform items into magical objects that fly off shelves! In other words, our job is all about preparing library resources for you to borrow!

When new materials arrive, the journey begins! The process includes stamping them with the date, adding stickers and labels, as well as checking and updating records, also known as 'cataloguing'. Cataloguing impacts how the records will look in the system, which helps you and library staff find items on computers, phones, or tablet devices. The catalogue and the labels we put on items helps to tell us where items need to be shelved or if we need to check for extras (such as discs). We also encode items, which is why materials 'beep' when they leave if they are unborrowed. Well, either that or the protection charm!

Our job is also about maintaining the quality of the collection. We do this by repairing library resources, removing old or damaged items and reorganising! Although we love books, we also get to process some other fantastic objects. We recently started a brand-new collection of Nintendo Switch games. When we start a new collection, we get to shape how that collection will be presented. This includes the way the labels look and how the records will be catalogued!

Everyone knows that reading is magic, but I think our job is pretty magical too!







Fulvous: a tawny yellow/brown, often used to describe animals.

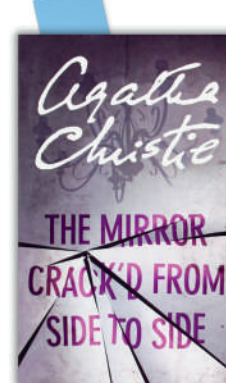
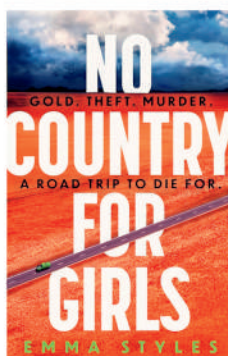
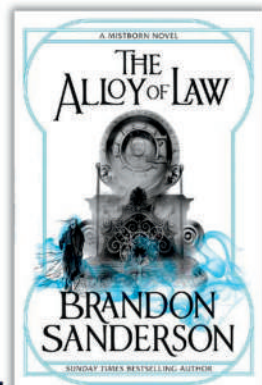
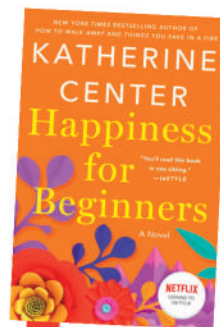
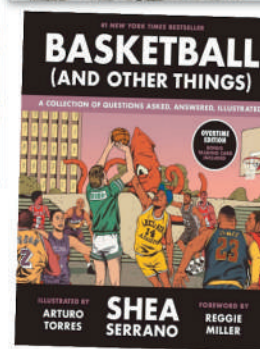
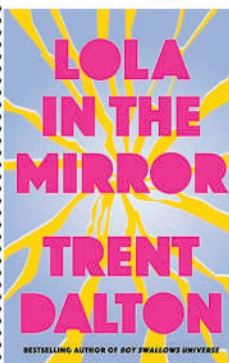
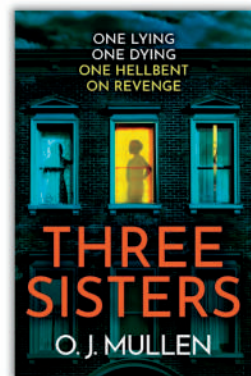
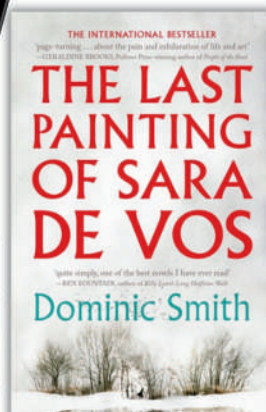
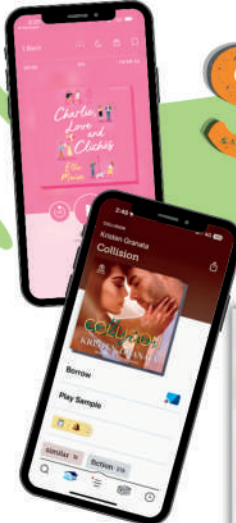
Glaucous: a dull grey blue, as seen on the skin of a plum.

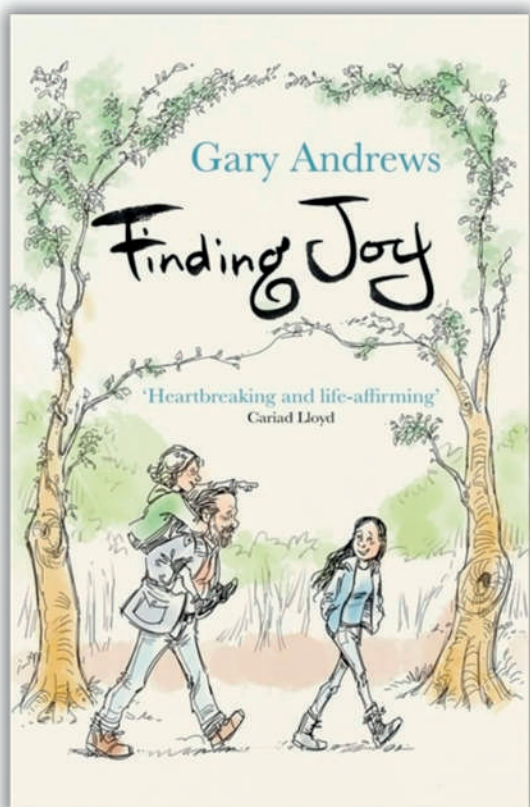
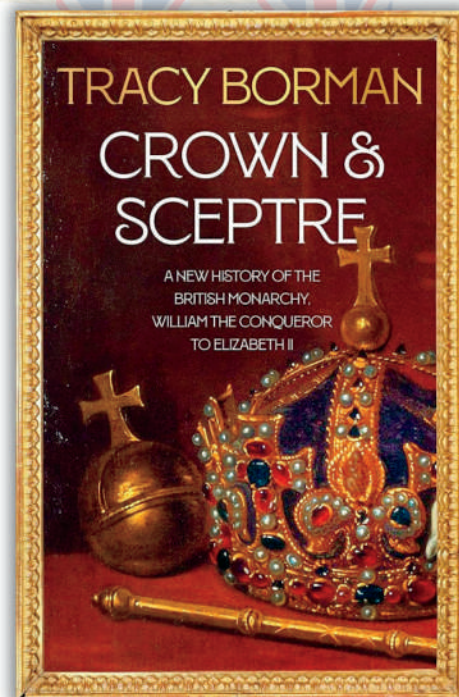


ANNETTE'S Reviews

CROWN & SCEPTRE: 1000 YEARS OF KINGS AND QUEENS

Tracy Borman

Not just another English history book, this gives a precis of each of England's monarchs, from William the Conqueror to Elizabeth II. The introduction covers the period before this, from about 200BC, before the Romans arrived. Each monarch receives equal treatment in this book, although of course more is known about the more recent reigns. I found I had to read this properly, no skipping bits, so it took me a week to get through it – but it was worth the time. Tracy Borman may be familiar to you – she has presented several English historical television programmes and is the Joint Chief Curator of Historic Royal Palaces. She writes very well.




FINDING JOY ***Gary Andrews***

This one is heartbreaking. Gary Andrews' wife, Joy, died suddenly as he was flying back from Canada, where he had been working. Gary was left with their two children, aged ten and seven. This book chronicles the journey of this little family as they negotiate their grief and learn to live without their wife and mum. Gary has illustrated the book, and also records the humorous little things that happen along the way. Although incredibly sad, the story is not without hope. If you have had a tragedy in your own life, you will be able to relate to Gary's experiences. Read it.



The current Heritage Gallery exhibition 'Down the Line' explores the themes of communication and its role in building communities. The exhibition explores the impact of the postal service, the telegraph and the telephone on the Gawler community allowing them to stay connected to each other and the wider world.

View rare early colonial letters, telegraph equipment brought to South Australia by Charles Todd and a collection of funky antique phones. Make a call using the magneto telephone and try your hand at Morse code with our telegraph equipment. Hear the voices of the women of the Gawler telephone exchange as they *'connect your call'*.

This exhibition is an opportunity to understand more about the evolution of communication technologies that have been fundamental in keeping communities informed and connected.
