Angie Barefield (Visitor Information Centre team) was also commended for 25 years of service, but was unable to be present on the day.

Snapshot of Town of Gawler's amazing volunteer contributions

Each year, National Volunteer Week provides a chance to recognise the vital work of volunteers and to say 'thank you'.

In 2021, Town of Gawler saw 108 active Council volunteers donate 7425 hours across our nine different volunteer programs, these being:

- Civic Centre
- Cultural Heritage Centre
- Graffiti Removal Program
- Home Assist Program
- Library
- Skating Program Visitor Information Centre
- Youth Program

According to the latest official records regarding the current replacement hourly figure for volunteers, this means our Town of Gawler volunteers make an economic contribution of more than \$330,000 to Council services each year. **Our long service recipients**
