'Down the Line' The Gawler Cultural Heritage Centre wins another national award.

Town of Gawler's '*Down the Line*' exhibition has received the 2023 Interpretation Australian National Award for Excellence in the Indoors: Under \$75,000 project category.

The exhibition, which opened at the Gawler Heritage Gallery in May, explores how the postal service, the telegraph and the telephone exchange kept the Gawler community connected to each other and the wider world.

Key Point

• This is the third Interpretation Australia national award won by the Gawler Cultural Heritage Centre

The aim of this exhibition was to deliberately target two groups of people in the community with stories and learnings around communication. Young people whose experience of personal communication is smart phone driven and very much focused on individual handheld devices and older people who have lived experience of more outmoded communication practices.

The exhibition explores the growth and changes in technology that have led us to the era of smart phones and explores the challenges of the preceding technologies. It also aims to reconnect older people with their memories of STD calls, operator enabled calls, receiving telegrams and aerograms and the hobby of stamp collecting.

You can view rare early colonial letters, telegraph equipment brought to South Australia by Charles Todd and a collection of funky antique phones.

Play with exchange equipment and listen to the voices of the women of the Gawler telephone exchange as they 'connect your call'.

Visitors are encouraged to see if they can beat the clock with a letter sorting challenge and try their hand at morse code with our telegraph equipment. They can connect to the hobby of stamp collecting through the free giveaway packets of fun and colorful stamps from around the world.

This exhibition is an opportunity to understand more about the evolution of communication technologies that have been fundamental in keeping communities informed and connected.

In their summation, the expert panel of judges commented on the innovative submission we presented which included a short film. They commented that the exhibition was well thought out and artfully executed.
