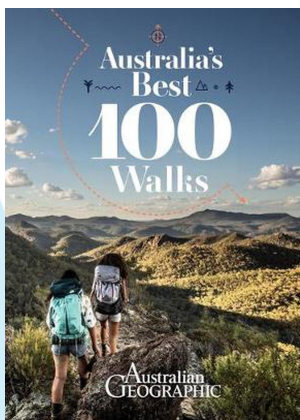
Walk To Work Day

to get better acquainted with your local area. Do you know about the walking trails in Gawler? If you check out the Gawler website, you'll find lots of inspiration for your walking adventures.

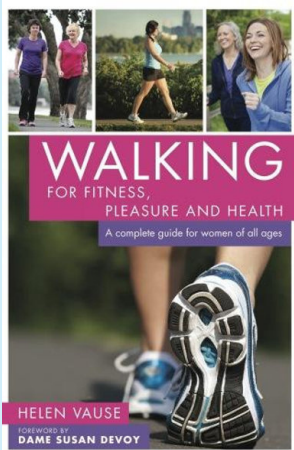

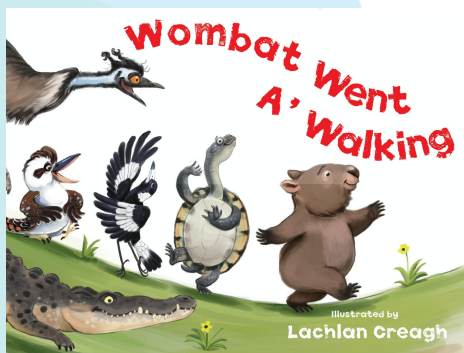
Did you know:

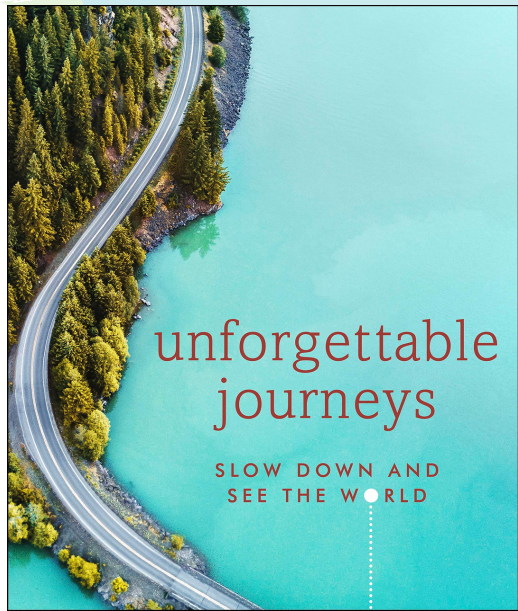

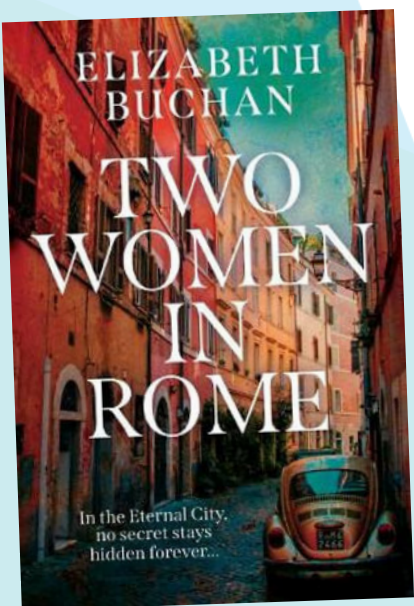
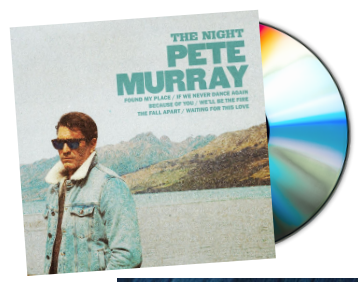

The advertising in this magazine is from local or surrounding suburban businesses. This makes it easy to shop locally, keep your money in the community and support local businesses and families.

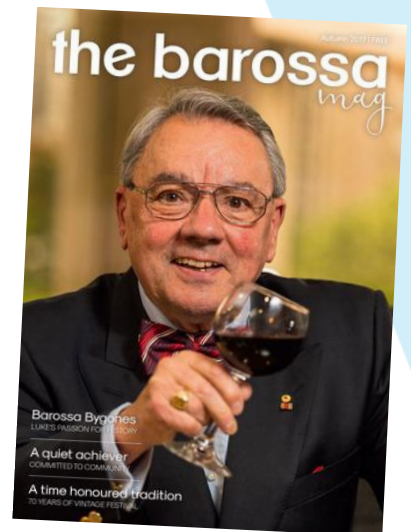
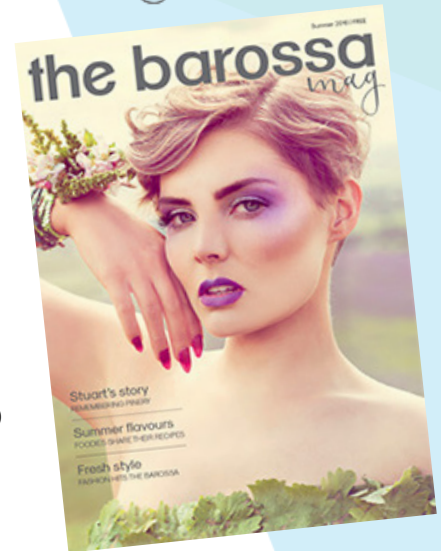

EVENING READS



The Uncommon Reader by Alan Bennett

It's short, funny and very entertaining. The book is about Queen Elizabeth II and her unexpected (fictional) discovery of books. One morning, while chasing her corgis, Her Majesty stumbles across the City of Westminster mobile library parked outside the palace kitchen. Out of courtesy she borrows a book. It's by Ivy Compton-Burnett and not an easy read, but the Queen's upbringing compels her to finish it. A week later, she borrows Nancy Mitford's *The Pursuit of Love* and so begins her journey into the realm of books.

It's a fascinating voyage of discovery and the Queen is ably assisted by young Norman who works in the kitchen, then promoted by the Queen to be near her every day to advise and discuss books with her. He and the Queen develop a firm friendship. He wakes up 'to how sharp she was and how much wasted'. In many ways, this is the underlying theme of the story.

The Queen is transformed as she discovers the liberating pleasures of the written word. She finds herself devouring works by a tantalizing range of authors, from the Brontë sisters to Jean Genet. It's not long before she begins to develop a new perspective on the world – one that alarms her closest advisors and tempts her to make bold new decisions. She becomes a voracious reader and, to her staff's dismay, begins talking about books to the people she meets at functions. Eager to share her new-found passion, she no longer sticks to the script. It's all very funny and so well-written that you find yourself believing every word.

Alan Bennett has great fun depicting the Queen's reactions to various authors. 'Am I alone' she says, 'in wanting to give Henry James a good talking-to?' She quickly discovers the pleasure of reading. Her Majesty has always put duty before pleasure, now books are having their way with her. 'Books did not care who was reading them ... all readers were equal, herself included'. *The Uncommon Reader* is brilliant on many levels but it's also a delicious, edible morsel of a novel.

Deliciously funny, a novella that celebrates the pleasure of reading. By turns cheeky and charming.

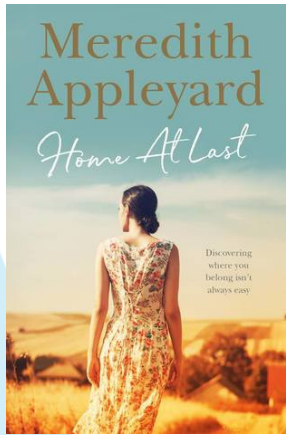

Meredith Appleyard

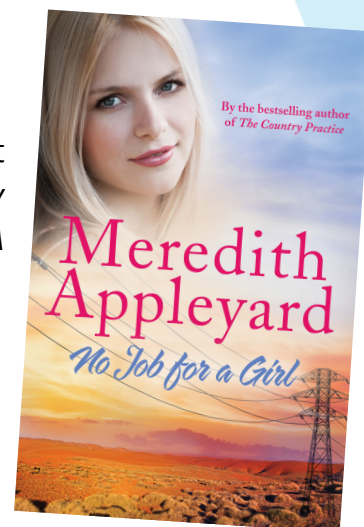
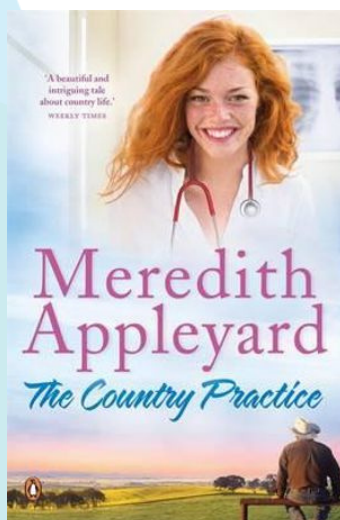
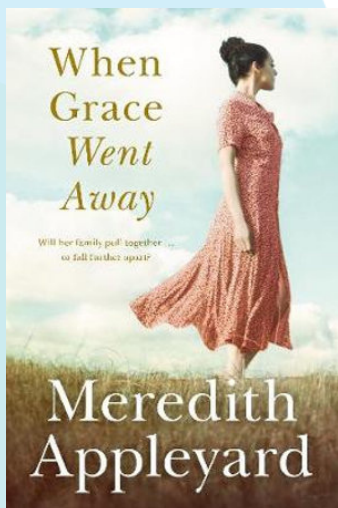
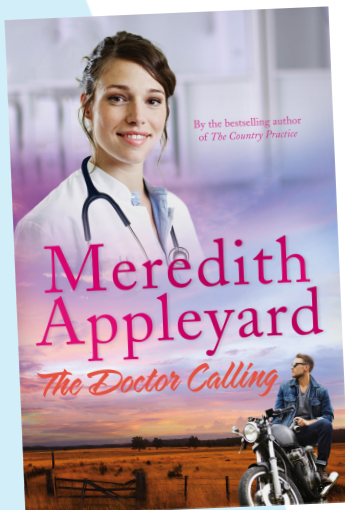
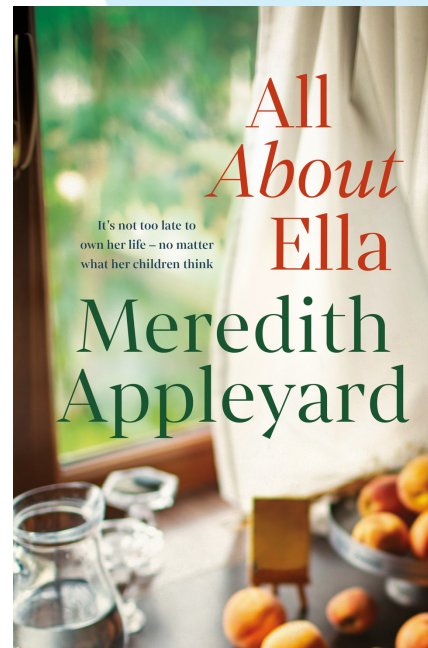

USING THE LIBRARY...



Printing at the Gawler Libraries

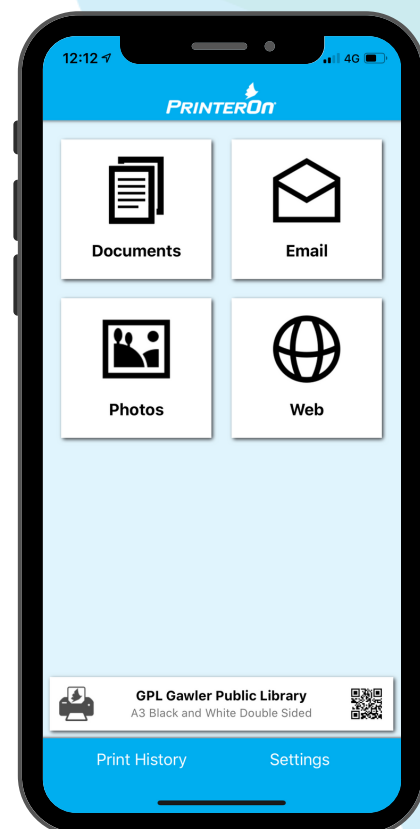


Did you know you can print from home with the Gawler Library? There's an app you can use on your smart device called PrinterOn. It is available as a FREE download from your device's app store. Your print jobs will be kept in our system for up to 3 days, so you can send everything you need to print to whichever location is most convenient to you, then pop into that library within three days to pay and collect.

Installing the PrinterOn app to your smartphone or tablet

To print from your device, you will first need to install the PrinterOn app.

- Install and launch the PrinterOn app
- Click No Printer Selected
- Click Search
- Search for Gawler – this will show printers at both the Gawler and Evanston Gardens Libraries
- Select your preferred default printer (e.g A4 black and white, A3 colour). This can be changed at any time



There are four options for printing; Documents, Email, Photos and Web.

- **Documents** – click on Documents and select Locations to choose the document to print
- **Email** – click on Email and select your email account. For first time use, use the plus sign (+), select your email provider and enter the requested details
- **Photos** – click on Photos and select a photo to print.
- **Web** – enter URL and click Go

How to print from the PrinterOn app:

Open the PrinterOn app.

- Select the printer and click the printer icon in the top right hand corner
- Click **Print**
- Enter your email address and click on the tick in the right top hand corner. You will receive a notification that the print job has started. Shortly after, you will receive another notification stating that the print job has been successful. The print job has been sent to the library.
- At the library, go to the Print Release Kiosk, and select **Release a Print Job**
- Enter the email address you previously supplied and select your print job
- Pay for your printing using cash or card, and your print job will be printed

Connecting to others

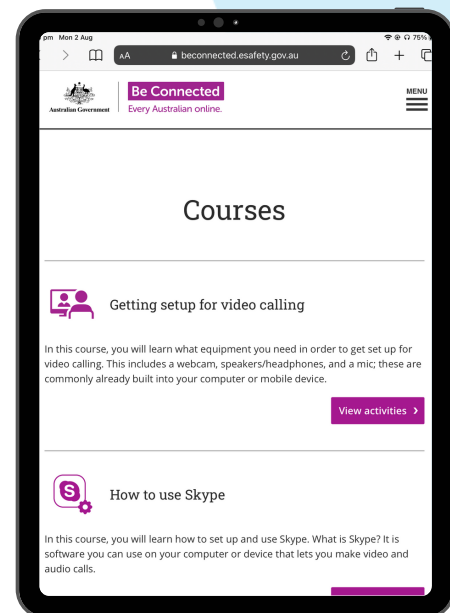

Did you use apps like Zoom, Facetime or Skype to keep in touch with friends and family while you were stuck at home? Would you like to know more about your options for connecting to others? The Be Connected website is a fantastic resource with lots of tutorials for learning about

all things digital. There is a specific set of courses that will take you through, step-by-step, to set up and use Zoom, FaceTime, Skype and WhatsApp, as well as information to remember to keep you safe while using the technology. It's simple and easy to follow, with helpful diagrams and printable guides to keep for reference later. As always, the library staff can assist you to get onto the website and navigate to the courses you're



interested in. We have a **FREE** live presentation all about how to set up for connecting with others to be held at the Gawler Civic Centre on the 30th September. So ask library staff for all the information and add it to your calendar so you don't miss out!

This September in the Gawler Institute Hall, you will be able to experience **Recovering the Past**. This exhibition is an innovative photographic project of 25 striking and thought-provoking images, not a project of war itself, but a philosophical exploration of consequences of human conflict, of legacies that persist long after the guns fall silent. The exhibition brings together two separate groups of men with origins a century apart, but who are united through a tragic conflict. One being the famed 'Diggers' of the Australian Imperial Force (AIF) who fought in Flanders in some of the worst battles of the Great War; the other, the personnel of the ongoing bomb disposal efforts on the same former battlefields today.
