Pedestrian Safety Upgrades Enhance Redbanks Road Intersection

Pedestrian safety has taken a significant leap forward at the roundabout intersection of Redbanks Road / Weyland Road / Haines Road and Dawson Road in Willaston, Gawler following completion of major footpath and roadworks.

The works were funded by the State Government as part of the 2022 election commitments for the area.

The \$760,000 project has been delivered by the Town of Gawler on behalf of the State Government and provides improvements through enhanced and safer pedestrian infrastructure and facilities in the vicinity of the roundabout and the adjacent section of Redbanks Road.

The upgrades encompass a range of improvements aimed at promoting safe and accessible pedestrian movement.

Key Points

- the installation of new shared use paths and kerb ramp connections along Redbanks Road.
- introduction of a pedestrian crossing refuge facility on Redbanks Road, positioned north of the roundabout.
- Additionally, road reconstruction and new kerbing was undertaken on Morgan Court to ensure optimal safety measures are in place.

The construction works commenced in late July 2023 and were completed mid-October. Night works occurred to reduce the impact on traffic flow, particularly during the morning and afternoon peak hour periods.

Council engaged the services of Camco SA Pty Ltd to undertake the construction works which included regular updates to the community throughout the project to keep residents, businesses, and stakeholders informed of progress and any relevant changes.
